



John Piatti, Sr. (Johnny Piatti), 82, passed away Tuesday, Dec. 4th from a combination of failing health and living a full and joyful life on his terms. Born in King City in 1936, and living his entire days along the Central Coast of California, he considered Morro Bay his home. Piatti was a devoted husband, married to his lifelong love, Doreen, since 1955, and was an exemplary father to six sons, seven grandchildren, and great-grandfather to six more. He served years as a member and Elder of the Salinan Tribe of San Luis Obispo and Monterey Counties.

Counted among John's many talents were house painting, billiards, fishing, golf, and just being able to make almost anyone smile, if he liked the individual; or grimace, if he didn't. A consummate storyteller, he found the truth to be the best source of humor, and his quick, honest wit often earned him many admirers.

Among his professional accomplishments, Piatti worked as a commercial fisherman in Morro Bay's abalone industry. Employed as a laborer, he participated in building Diablo Canyon's breakwaters. Along with stretches as a tug-boat crewman and working in coastal mines, he ran his own commercial painting business for years.

The immediate family is holding a private service, and will announce a memorial celebration to be held in the Spring of 2019, with plenty of coffee, cigarettes and barbeque to be served. In remembrance, the family would ask that anyone wishing to participate may donate in the name of John Piatti, Sr., to any animal rescue service of their choice.

#### **Roots and Recipes Book**

VERN'S ALWAYS TENDER PIE CRUST

3 cups flour ½ tsp. salt
1 cup shortening, chilled
1 egg, beaten
1 tsp. apple cider vinegar
Water (as needed)



Combine flour with salt, then cut in shortening until particles resemble small peas. Combine egg, vinegar, and enough water to make ½ cup in a glass-measuring cup. Sprinkle the egg mixture gradually over flour mixture, and mix with a stainless steel pastry blender until dough forms a ball. Divide dough into thirds.

For each single crust, roll out one-third dough on a floured board or pastry cloth to fit a 9-inch pie plate. Flute edges after placing in pie plate. Use with any pie recipe. Makes three single, p-inch crusts. Filling and Topping: By Mary Ann Pierce

#### Filling:

2 - 51.oz Instant Vanilla Pudding

2 - Packs Dry Dream Whip

4 – cups milk

1½ - cups Bakers Sweetened Angel Flake coconut

Mix pudding, dry dream whip and milk, mix well, and add coconut. Fill cool piecrust.

Whip Cream Topping:

2 cups real whipping cream

1 tbsp. sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup to asted coconut, sprinkle on top of whipped cream.
