RECIPE CORNER

ALMOND PINE-NUT COOKIES

Makes: 28 cookies

Bake: 325 degrees for 15 minutes

Ingredients:

7 ounces almond paste, cut into small pieces

1/3 cup sugar

2 eggs whites

1/2 tsp. Vanilla

1/2 tsp. Orange Extract

3 Tbs. all-purpose flour

1/2 cup pine nuts

Line baking sheet with parchment paper or foil. Coat with non-stick cooking spray.

Beat together almond paste, sugar & 1 egg white in medium-size bowl until smooth. Beat second egg white, then vanilla and orange extracts. Stir in flour until dough forms.

Drop batter by heaping teaspoonful, 2 inches apart on prepared sheets. Cover each cookie with pine nuts, about 15 min.

Cool cookies on sheet, on rack.
