Salinan Park & Garden at Maritime Museum Morro Bay

In collaboration with The Maritime Museum and City of Morro Bay, The Salinan Garden project was born. Donny Pierce spearheaded the project, working on design, power, and water.

Located at The Maritime Museum, on the Morro Bay Embarcadero, this is an artistic expression of Salinan culture, a garden to gather, and slice of nature, with a view of Le'Samo.

Volunteers have cleared debris, ground a tree stump into useful mulch, graded the site and amended the soil for better water retention. Saturday, March 12, volunteers implemented phase one, the first native plantings, a bay tree, two coffee berries, and two varieties of sage.

We need volunteers who love to garden, have knowledge of native and useful plants, aspire to share a craft, create art, and gather.

Pam's Pie Crust

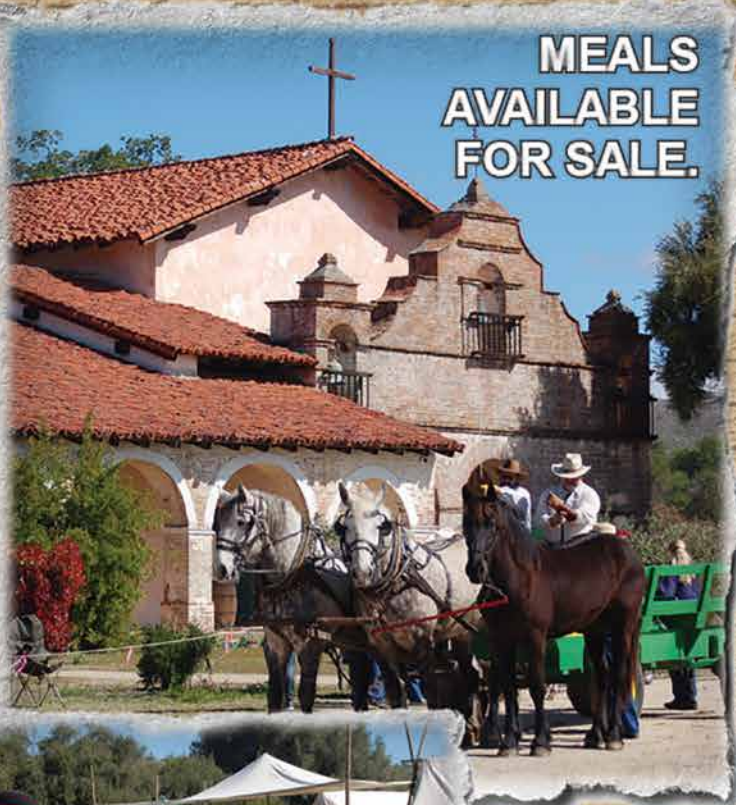
