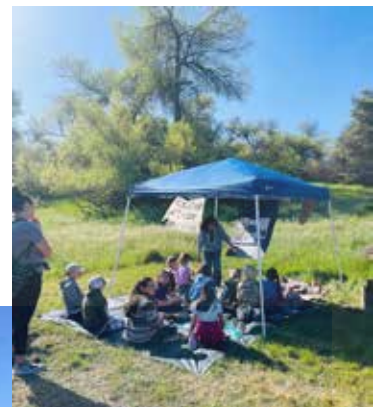
Annual BBQ Fundraiser

Fred served on the Tribal Council for eight years. He was very involved with the monitoring, consulting and represented the Tribe during reburial issues. He very much enjoyed sharing the culture of the Salinan People. He was a very soft spoken and caring person. He will be deeply missed.

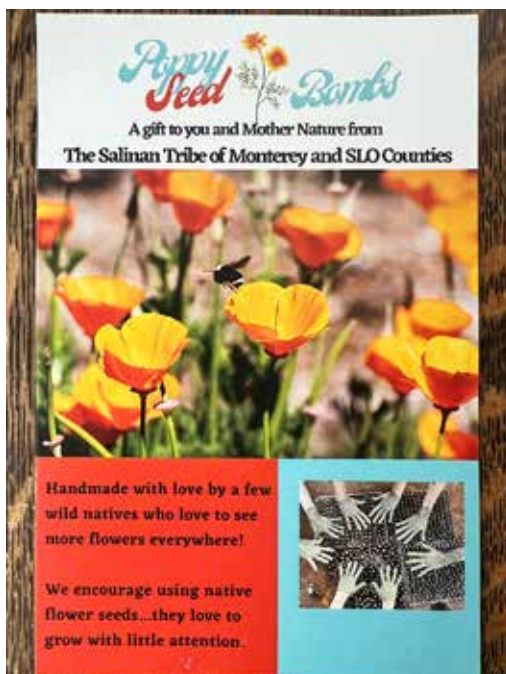

The drive to the site is beautiful, and the site is visible from a distance, it is obvious why our ancestors chose this special place to write about their life and experiences on stone with pigments gathered and created on location, probably in the mortars that dot the floor of this magnificent cave.
