Tribal Announcements:

Our family is very pleased to announce that our daughter, Christina Goss recently received a full tuition scholarship to attend UC Irvine from the Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria (FIGR)! Shortly before Christina's graduation from Nipomo High School in June, she was accepted to 4 SoCal Universities, UC Riverside, UC Irvine, CSU Fullerton, CSU Long Beach, and additionally to Arizona State. Fortunately, after touring the 4 SoCal campuses she decided she would attend UC Irvine. At the time, we were prepared to take out Parent Plus loans to pay for her education but, soon heard about the FIGR UC Scholarship. The following description is taken directly from the scholarship application:

The Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria Tribal Council has established the UC Scholarship (the "Scholarship"). The Scholarship covers tuition and fees, and professional degree supplemental tuition, depending on availability of funds, for UC students who are California Native Americans but not members of a federally recognized tribe. The Scholarship complements the UC Native American Opportunity Plan ("UC NAOP"), which provides a similar scholarship for UC students who are members of federally recognized Indian tribes. To be eligible for the Scholarship, you must either a) have a Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB) showing a California tribal affiliation; or b) descend from a person with a CDIB showing a California tribal affiliation, on the California census rolls of 1928 or 1933, or on the California Judgment Fund Rolls of 1953 or 1972.

You must submit a completed application and attach the following listed documents that will be used to evaluate your application for the UC Scholarship

1. A copy of Drivers License/Identification Card (name must match the application and birth certificate, if you are submitting one)
2. A copy of CDIB or certified copies of original Birth/Death Certificates
3. Completed Family Tree form

The scholarship application deadline for the current academic year was July 15, 2022 but we are hopeful the scholarship will continue to be available in future years.
