


June 21st, Summer Solstice, Morro Rock (Lesamo), Morro Bay

Patti Dunton and Yvonne Davis hosted 2 days of Salinan Tribe learning presentations, for 8 classes of 3rd graders, at Adobe Springs Nature Preserve.

Classrooms came to learn about local history and see the natural spring, which emerges from the land, bubbling up through white sand. Through monitoring excavations, it was confirmed that a Salinan village site had been right near the spring.

Students learned about the native plants and native people of the area. Patti & Yvonne talked about the ways elderberry was used, and let the kids try a clapper stick.

Wild lilac is growing at the preserve. They demonstrated how you could quickly make lilac blossoms into soap, by rubbing it in your hands with water. Students enjoyed picking their own lilac to take home and try. This area had been called, Ko' lok' ne, by the Salinan Indians.
