The San Salvador event in Morro Bay was a collaborative effort between The Salinan Tribe and The Morro Bay and San Diego Maritime Museum. This remarkable occasion was made possible by the unwavering commitment and tireless contributions of our dedicated volunteer crew. Our showcase featured Salinan story boards, artifacts, and merchandise, and a diverse range of offerings, including captivating demonstrations and hands on kelp bulb rattle making and rock painting activities for children.

Doreen Piatti's exquisite homemade elderberry jelly was offered to attendees on Pam Flood's homemade bread, which was made with Ken and Mary Ann Pierce's hand processed acorn flour.

Sue Taylor Pierce and her books were available.

Robert Piatti curated a pop-up booth showcasing art and antiquities, enriching the experience with his profound insights into Salinan wisdom and maritime artifacts available for purchase.

Our tribe gifted The Maritime Museum with an original framed photograph by Mary Ann Pierce, capturing Salinans extending greetings to the San Salvador replica in 2016 visit.

This immersive event attracted over 10,000 visitors, enabling us to share the essence of our culture in an engaging and memorable manner.

August 19th2023, The inaugural launch of "Contemporary Indigenous Voices of California's South Coast Range" marked a remarkable achievement, characterized by seamless execution and resounding success. The five short films, totaling 45 minutes in duration, deeply resonated with the audience, accompanied by compelling demonstrations and a thought-provoking panel discussion. During this discussion, participants openly shared their insights and wisdom pertaining to topics such as land, climate change, and culture.

Tribes represented: Tribe of the Nation, Indian Canyon Mutsun Band of Costanoan-Ohlone People, Amah Mutsun Tribal Band, the Rumsen Ohlone Tribal Community, Esselen Tribe of Monterey County, and the Salinan Tribe of San Luis Obispo and Monterey Counties and Salinan Trowtraahl tribal community.

The event garnered an impressive public turnout, generating a wave of positive feedback. Patti Dunton, Mary & Jessica Rodgers, and Shaunie Briggs represented The Salinan Tribe.

The day concluded with a shared dinner, fostering a sense of camaraderie and contentment among attendees. Heartfelt gratitude is extended to the indigenous participants who graced the occasion.

Special appreciation is extended to the Santa Cruz Museum of Arts and History for hosting the exhibition and to California Humanities for All Grant Project for their support and partial funding. The role of Fiscal Sponsor BenitoLink and the generosity of other sponsors cannot be overstated, as their contributions were pivotal in making this endeavor a reality.







### The Council Election Is Approaching Soon

This is an election year. If you plan on running for a council seat in this year's election you can drop off, send or email your letters of intent to the Tribal office starting September 17, 2023. They must be received no later than October 15, 2023. The earlier you get them in, they can be printed in the October and November newsletters. Remember you must be a qualified member at least 30 years of age. And for those elders wanting to run for an elder seat, you must be at least 65 years old. The terms of office are 4 years for council and 2 years for elder's council. The current council terms that are up this year and need to run are Sharon Thomas, Pamela Flood, Yvonne Davis, Patti Dunton, Robert Piatti, and John Piatti Jr. And for elders' council Yvonne Ayala, Kenneth Pierce, and Leslie Montgomery.
